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# MICHAEL RUSSOTTO RETURNS FOR ANOTHER RUN IN THE SOLO VERSION OF A CHRISTMAS CAROL: A GHOST STORY OF CHRISTMAS

Production will continue to use Paul Morella's adaptation, which is 99% Dickens' original language

Olney, MD – November 5, 2025 – Renowned Washington actor, Michael Russotto, will reprise his role in the 16th edition of Paul Morella's solo adaptation of Charles Dickens' A Christmas Carol: A Ghost Story of Christmas at Olney Theatre Center. Senior Associate Artistic Director Hallie Gordon writes, "We're so very fortunate that Michael Russotto, who stepped in for creator Paul Morella last year, has agreed to return for another run up the theatrical mountain of this solo show, which requires him to inhabit nearly fifty different characters over the course of its action. Those of you who have seen both Paul's and Michael's performances know that they're different, but both share precise attention to the rhythms and humor in Dickens' language, and the warm heart at the center of this tale."

Previews begin in the Mulitz-Gudelsky Theatre Lab on the day after Thanksgiving, November 28, 2025. Russotto stepped in last year, after a serious medical episode meant that Morella could not return to perform the show he created. While Morella continues to recover, his son Michael Morella says, "Everything is still trending in the right direction, albeit very, very, very slowly. We'll take it, but we'll continue to hope for more -- and he's getting good care."

Morella's version of the story is distinguished by its faithfulness to Dickens' prose, as well as by the fact that a single actor plays every one of the play's nearly fifty characters. This unique retelling of the classic tale has been referred to by DC Theater Arts as "the story's most authentic form," "beautifully detailed," and the "purest and truest version out there," as well as by DC Theatre Scene as a "remarkable journey" and "magical experience," offering "a wonder that continued to affect me days after seeing the show." It has also been praised by

critics writing for outlets including *The Washington Post*, *Washington City Paper*, *MD Theatre Guide*, and countless more.
