# MELODY A. BETTS JOINS THE CAST OF *FELA!* AS FUNMILAYO Before joining the Broadway-bound tour of <u>The Wiz</u>, Betts will spend the summer playing Fela's martyred mother. Themba Mkhatshwa also joins the ensemble playing the djembe.

Betts has joined the cast of **Olney Theatre Center and Round House Theatre's** co-production of Fela!, which, **begins previews on Olney Theatre's Roberts Mainstage, July 7. Running through August 13,** the Tony Award-winning musical uses the songs of Fela Kuti and a book created by **Bill T. Jones and Jim Lewis** to tell the story of the Pan-African superstar's final concert at the legendary Afrika Shrine. The revival, the first full production since the National Tour closed in 2013, is directed by Lili-Anne Brown, who recently received the Helen Hayes Award for Outstanding **Director of a Play** for her work on Woolly Mammoth's *Ain't No Mo'*. **Duain Richmond** tackles the titular role, which he played both on Broadway and in subsequent "Fela: The Concert" presentations. Nova Y. Payton, who had originally been announced to play Funmilayo, had to withdraw from the production for a family matter.
